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1. Introduction

First Aid is defined as:

(a) [occasions] where a person requires treatment for the purpose of preventing the consequences of injury and illness until such help is available

(b) treatment of minor injuries which do not need treatment by a medical practitioner or nurse.

Staff administering First Aid should protect themselves and the casualty from further danger and, where necessary, obtain medical assistance as quickly as possible.

2. Policy
